#### What is a HPSA?

- Health Professional Shortage Areas (HPSAs) are rational service areas that demonstrate a critical shortage of primary care, dental or mental health providers.
- The Ohio Department of Health's Primary Care Office submits applications for HPSA designations to the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) based on criteria established by federal regulation. HRSA has the authority to approve or disapprove HPSA applications. HPSAs are federal designations.

#### Types of HPSAs

- 1. Geographic HPSAs entire population
- Special population HPSAs low-income and Medicaid-eligible populations
- 3. Facility HPSAs include:
  - Public or non-profit facilities that serve residents of a designated HPSA
  - State and federal correctional facilities
  - State and county psychiatric hospitals
  - Automatic HPSAs: <u>Rural Health Clinics</u> that meet specific requirements and all FQHCs and FQHC Look-Alikes




#### State Rational Service Area Plan

 State Rational Service Area Plan requires our office to create rational areas for the entire state of Ohio even if they did not qualify as a HPSA.

#### Rural, Partially Rural VS Urban

- Ohio is comprised of 88 counties
- 50 rural counites
- 22 partially rural counites
- 16 urban counites



# Counties without cities larger than 10,000.

There are currently 30 counites in Ohio that do not contain a single city with a population greater than 10,000 residents. Those counties should default to a full county HPSA.
