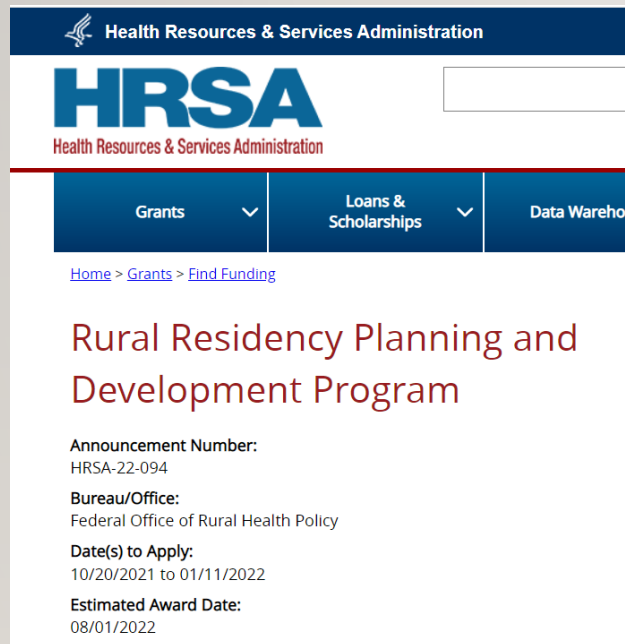

- HRSA Rural Residency and Development Grant
 - 4th round of funding anticipated for later this year
 - \$750,000, three year grant

RURAL GRADUATE MEDICAL EDUCATION

- Rural Rotation(s) - two or four weeks
- Rural Track – more than one rotation of 2/4 weeks
- Rurally located residency
- Rural Training Program (1+ x)
 - Over 50% of the training is at a rural site

OHIO RURAL TRAINING

- Family Medicine (8)
- Psychiatry (1)
- Internal Medicine (3)
- Women's Health (0)
- Surgery (0)



WHY BUILD A RURAL RESIDENCY?

- We have been inspired by our mentors
- We take care of patients and plan for future
 - Rural graduates practice rural 3x, residents often practice near their program (19% within 5 miles)
- Rural medicine is good work – share!
- Build on med school pipeline
 - 4 rural programs in OH

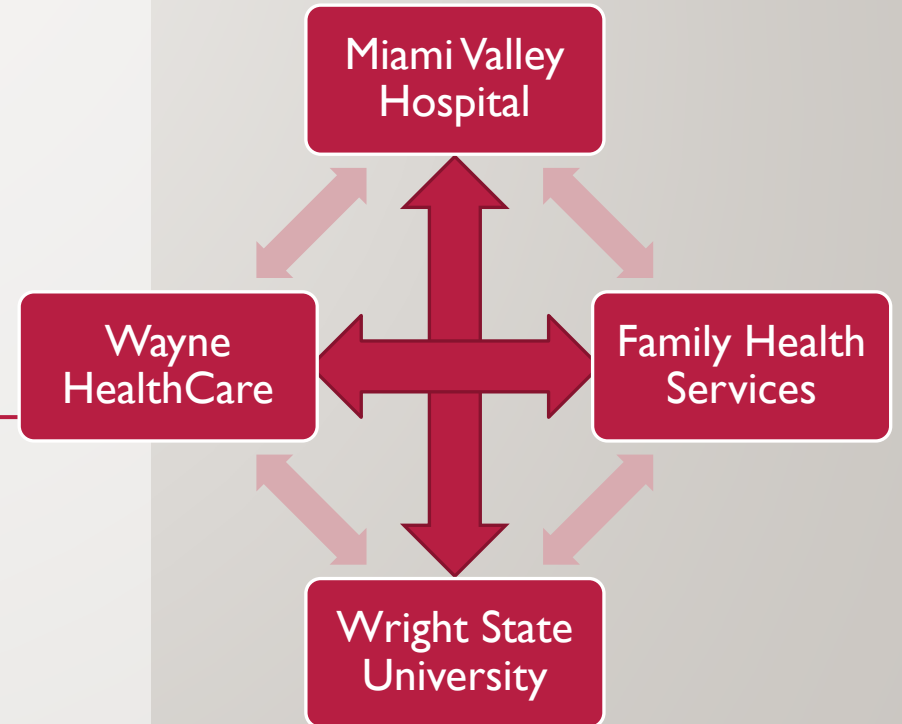
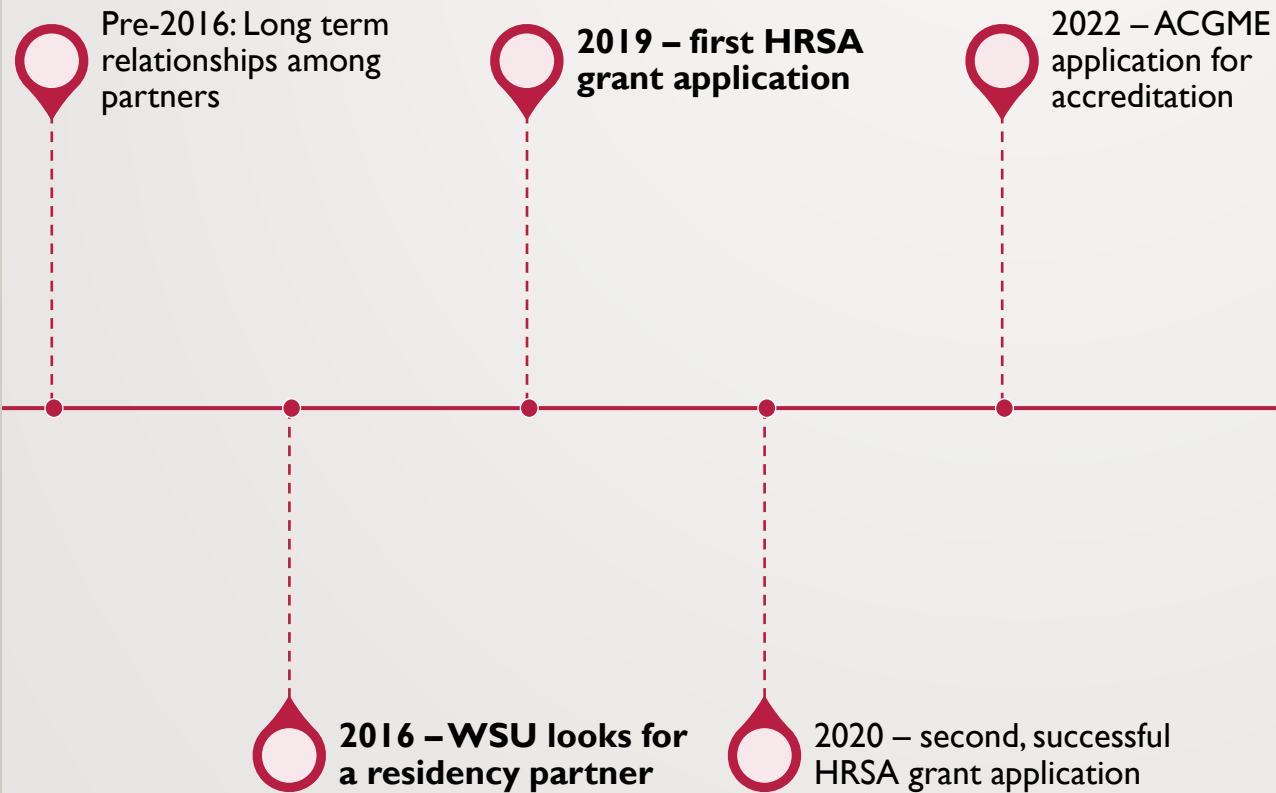
