My interest in rural areas began in graduate school at the University of New Hampshire. My thesis work involved an analysis of land use change an a rapidly urbanizing section of the state. This was in the mid-1980s and people in southeastern New Hampshire were alarmed at the rate that the state was growing and what it meant for the environment. This interest carried into my PhD research at The Ohio State University as I examined the controversy around siting a facility to manage low-level radioactive waste in Ohio. I found it interesting that rural areas were often the target for operations that could cause environmental harms. In my work at Ohio EPA in the 1990s, I became aware of the direct connection between environmental conditions and human health as I was involved in helping rural communities improve their wastewater treatments systems.


