What is the role of social service referral networks?

- Integrate health care and social care
- Care coordination and information sharing through common referral platform
- Long-term objectives: improve health outcomes and reduce disparities

Why are referral networks gaining momentum?

- Preventive, value-based healthcare
- Public policy changes
- Value in addressing social needs





Role of technology in care coordination

- Common platform enables secure sharing of client information
- Closed-loop functionality
- SDoH screening tools and referrals



Opportunities within social service referral networks

- Increase visibility of rural health & social service providers among health plans
- Coordinate and track internal referrals
- Maximize care coordination between local and regional providers
- Reach vulnerable populations through partnerships with health plans
- Increase accessibility to social services

Challenges facing rural Ohio

- Fewer social services providers in rural settings
- Buy-in from community stakeholders
- Access to transportation
- Digital divide
- Privacy requirements



Technology by itself is not the solution.

While technology is essential to sharing information and measuring impact, a successful social services network requires **cross-sector collaboration, alignment of values and objectives**, and **increased investment in critical social services** in order to truly address health inequities.





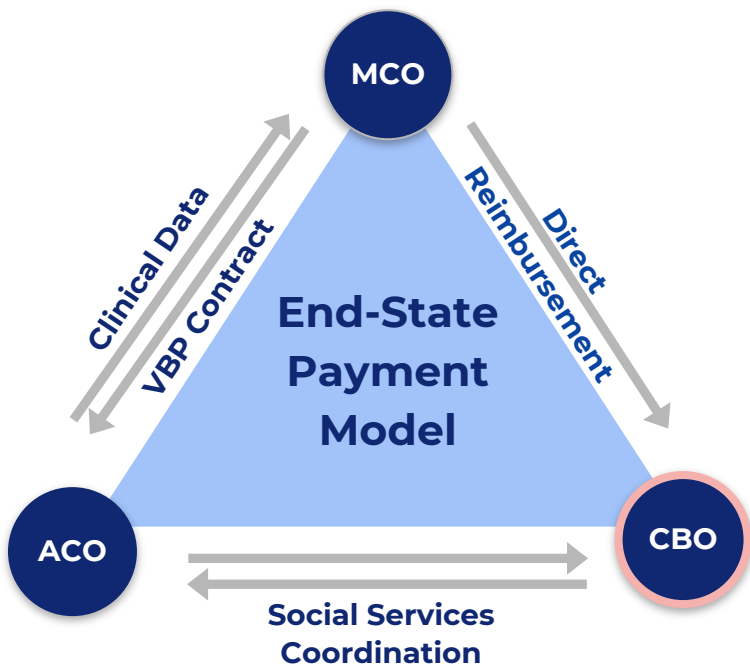
What's to come

Ohio Community Network

- Track referral and service data to determine impact on health outcomes and ROI
- Inform reimbursement models



Reimbursement models to fit the CBO and service type



Example reimbursement models:

- **Participation Grants**: most common early stage reimbursement
- **Fee for service**: can be appropriate for transactional services (e.g., food bags)
- **Case Rate**: can be appropriate for programmatic services (e.g., care coordination with wraparound services)
- **P4P/P4O**: only appropriate for the most sophisticated programs (e.g., FQHCs)

Public Policy changes to better address SDOH

- Medicaid 1115 waivers
- Expanded ICD-10 codes
- Quality withhold

Why Join the Ohio Community Network?

Healthify Network Participation Requirements for Community Based Organizations

To be eligible to participate, CBOs must:

- ☐ Provide direct services in some capacity
- ☐ Accept external referrals to at least one program or service

CBO partners agree to...

- ☐ Acknowledge every referral received from the network in a timely manner
- ☐ Resolve every referral received from the network - even if it means cancelling the referral.
 - *Service provision is not required if partner does not have capacity*
